

What is Specially Adapted Housing?

Specially Adapted Housing is a grant from the VA for certain service-connected veterans to help pay for part of the cost (not more than 50%) of building, buying or remodeling a specially adapted house or to pay the indebtedness on such homes already acquired. The maximum grant is \$43,000.

Who is eligible for Specially Adapted Housing?

Veterans who have a service-connected disability entitling them to compensation for permanent and total disability due to:

- 1. The loss, or loss of use of both lower extremities, such as to preclude locomotion without the aid of braces, crutches, canes or a wheelchair, or*
- 2. disability which includes (a) blindness in both eyes, having only light perception plus (b) loss or loss of use of one lower extremity, or*
- 3. the loss or loss of use of one lower extremity together with (a) residuals of organic disease or injury or (b) the loss or loss of use of one lower and one upper extremity, which so affects the functions of balance or propulsion as to preclude locomotion without resort to braces, crutches, canes or a wheelchair.*
